One of the many frustrating parts of all of this is that many representatives who are pushing these measures have stopped responding to the overwhelming number of calls and emails they are receiving. These "representatives" are placing their individual beliefs ahead of their constituents' desires. Elections have consequences. Local elections are just as important as national elections, arguably more so since they directly affect the residents of Michigan. The "representatives" who are sponsoring, cosigning, and passing these gun control laws are ignoring we the people.

The hypocrisy of some of these officials was on full display at our All Outdoor Sports Banquet. Despite frequently attending our banquet and supporting an unapologetic staunch defender of the Second amendment this "representative" cosigned the recently signed gun laws. Everyone knows it is very hard to repeal a law once it is passed so continue the pressure. Keep calling, e-mailing, and voting for individuals that support conservation and gun owners.

TRAP & SKEET REPORT by Mike Meyer

Since our last newsletter, we have been shooting caps at the rate of about one per week. So far, three high school trap team shooters have scored their first ever 25 straight. "Hats off" to Christian Lopez, Owen Brechtelsbauer and Cayden Geurts for their outstanding shooting, (pun intended). We had several other straights as shown below.

Now for some less than wonderful news – We will have to raise our shooting prices. Due to the high cost of clay pigeons, almost \$1000 a pallet, not to mention the cost of trap maintenance and utilities to run the trap and skeet programs, we will be raising the price of a round of skeet or trap to \$6. A 10 -punch shoot card will be \$50, and youth prices will be \$4 per round. This pricing -will take effect June 1.0

Bullseye--Precision Pistol Fundamentals by Brian Miller

- 1. Stance—The stance is primarily perpendicular to the target while making it comfortable. Rotate your stance so your red dot or iron sights are centered in the Bull.
- 2. Grip—The grip must be firm like a firm handshake but not to the point of causing tremors.
- 3. Sight Picture—This must be consistent each and every time whether it's a center of bull alignment or a 6 O'clock hold.
- 4. Trigger Pull—must be an uninterrupted pulling of the trigger until the pistol fires *while not moving the sight picture*. Generally, if you take the shot when it looks right the shot will be somewhere outside of the black. Usually low, left.

If the Bullseye shooter performs these fundamentals for each and every shot, it will be a good scoring shot. This can also be applied to any shooting discipline not just Bullseye. Hope this helps other shooters.

THE COWBOY'S CORNER by Barb Bell



This spring, it certainly didn't take our cowboys long to get back in the saddle, so to speak. Our first Wednesday night practice of the 2023 season found us ringing those steel targets at a wicked speed. Well, at least most of those targets were

ringing. I personally will admit to the occasional miss or procedural, but even then, my guttural groan was highlighted with the laughter of my pards. We'll improve in the weeks ahead.

On a not-so-sunny Saturday in April, five of us pards tackled raking and blowing the remaining leaves that fell on the cowboy range during the winter months. I will tell you that I love the fall, but detest raking leaves. I was thankful we had gotten most of them removed last fall, but we still had a lot of stragglers to round-up. The few sprinkles that fell that day gave us all the incentive needed to move a bit faster, getter done, and now it's lookin' good down in our little cowboy town. BIG thanks to those pards who helped out!

Last month I ciphered on what guns cowboy shooters use. This month I just wanted to explain briefly how those guns get carried around at our practices and shoots. We simply drag them around in a special mode of transportation...the cowboy cart, a major necessity.

Cowboy carts come in many different styles, two wheels or four, and can be purchased or handmade, wooden or metal. The shooter should always consider the weight of your guns and equipment; pulling a cart up hills or through sand or mud can be challenging if you've created a mini-covered wagon.

Our carts usually have compartments or detachable boxes to hold ammo, bullet bags, ear plugs, gun tools, and whatever the shooter thinks he needs. I put on a portable hanger on the back of mine to carry a bottled water. Long guns ride muzzle-up and are confined, usually separated, in their own divided space in the cart. A fun thing is for the shooter to decorate the exterior with his alias, or a western design. You can bet you'll usually never see two identical carts at a shoot.

I must not fail to tell you how great the majority of our shooters are if you are having trouble pulling your cart. It's a wonderful feeling when one offers to help you get that cart up or down a steep hill, or through quick-sand, and even when the shooter is having some physical problems. The politeness and willingness to help another shooter can be found at any shoot, at any time.

Last, but certainly not least, are our two pistols. They ride in our holsters, UNLOADED a majority of the shoot. (We only load just before we shoot.) Their job is to keep those pistols in a safe place, as our cowboy motto says: Safety first, last, and always.

Many t.v. cowboy shows highlight just one pistol, but in cowboy shooting, it's a two-holster rig. Many are designed for a specific category or style of shooting...duelist, gunfighter, cross-draw or traditional. And believe me, they can be plain and beautiful, or decorated with conchos, silver diamonds or coins, and fancy tooling designs.

So, that covers how we carry our guns and equipment from here to there. And, speaking of shoots, our first shoot of the season is Saturday, May 13th and we're looking to have a lot of fun and seeing all our pards. We'd love to see you there, too. Shooting starts around 10 a.m. and it won't cost you even a tiny speck of gold dust to just come and watch and meet us. And our Wednesday night practices always welcome you folks, 5 p.m. til dark.

Until next time, remember to live life....give it your best shot!

<u>Eligible Period for CPL Renewal:</u> Michigan Law, MCL 28.425l, provides your Michigan CPL is eligible for renewal from 6 months before your CPL expires and for one year after it has expired.

<u>CPL Renewal Certification:</u> Michigan law requires that CPL renewal applicants certify they have accomplished a minimum of three hours of review of CPL training and at least one hour of range firing time within six months before their renewal application. Note: making a false certification is a felony.
