The Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR) approved new deer-hunting regulations that will be effective for the 2023-2025 season. The following is an overview of the changes. Be sure to familiarize yourself with all of the changes to avoid any issues this fall.

- Four-point antler restrictions restored under the deer combo license was restored in 19 counties, including Barry, Calhoun, Ionia, Kent, Mecosta, Montcalm, Newaygo and Ottawa.
- Hunters may now harvest multiple antlerless deer in the Liberty Hunt, the buck limit is still one.
- The Upper Peninsula removed a chronic wasting zone from parts of Delta, Dickinson, and Menominee counties.
- Crossbows are not allowed during late archery season in the UP.
- Antlerless harvests are prohibited in a number of deer management units in Northern Michigan, including 007, 031, 042, 048, 066, 127 and 131.

MUCC NEWS

Legislature:

On June 8, the Michigan Senate passed stakeholder-led commercial guiding legislation on a bipartisan vote. The bill package now moves to the House and has been assigned to the House Natural Resources, Environment, Tourism, and Outdoor Recreation Committee.

Natural Resources Commission

The NRC voted on several deer regulation proposals at June's meeting. No season dates were changed, and no statewide APRs were passed. After hours of public comment, the commission acted on Wildlife Conservation Order #7 of 2023 and nine commissioner amendments

Commissioners passed Wildlife Conservation Order #5 of 2023, allowing off-lead tracking dogs to recover legally shot game species. This order had been tabled for months as commissioners and the DNR worked on the final language.

MUCC supports the use of off-lead tracking by qualified trackers. While this order is a step in the right direction per our grassroots policy, we would support a training requirement for dog and tracker and the CPL requirement.

Is defined as anyone 18 years of age and older who are not an immediate family residing in the same household as the general member. Guests are required to pay the \$5.00 guest fee for each range used. Mailboxes are located on each range. Immediate family is defined as your spouse and children. Youth ages 17 and under shoot free while companied by a general member.

TRAP & SKEET REPORT by Mike Meyer

Our high school trap teams both did great in the State Tournament. Nouvel Catholic – Freeland's Varsity team finished 2nd in the state, just 4 birds behind the state champ. The scores were Ryan McDonald – 98, Christian Lopez – 96, Ryan Quackenbush – 95, Charlie Beldyga – 94 and Thomas Witten – 94.

The Valley Lutheran Varsity tied for 13th in the State just 4 targets less than Nouvel-Freeland. The team's scores were Ben Tomandl – 98, Collin Engelhardt – 96, Zach Lamont – 96, Rylee Ross – 92, and Alex LaDouce – 91. Rylee experienced a gun breakdown the day before the tournament and shot her score with a borrowed gun that she had never shot before in competition.

Ben Tomandl and Ryan McDonald were tied for 4th place with only 3 shooters scoring better out of the more than 1200 shooters that participated. All of our high school shooters did well, shooting their average or, in most cases exceeding their average in the State Competition. Congratulations to all of our High School shooters. We are very proud of them all! Now they have the July 5-9 National Competition to look forward to.

Bullseye--Precision Pistol Fundamentals by Brian Miller

- 1. Stance—The stance is primarily perpendicular to the target while making it comfortable. Rotate your stance so your red dot or iron sights are centered in the Bull.
- 2. Grip—The grip must be firm like a firm handshake but not to the point of causing tremors.
- 3. Sight Picture—This must be consistent each and every time whether it's a center of bull alignment or a 6 O'clock hold.
- 4. Trigger Pull—must be an uninterrupted pulling of the trigger until the pistol fires *while not moving the sight pic-ture*. Generally, if you take the shot when it looks right the shot will be somewhere outside of the black. Usually low, left.

If the Bullseye shooter performs these fundamentals for each and every shot, it will be a good scoring shot. This can also be applied to any shooting discipline not just Bullseye. Hope this helps other shooters.

Saginaw Field & Stream Club 2023 Hunter Safety Class

Hunter education trains new hunters to be safe, legal and responsible hunters. Topics covered include understanding wildlife management, wildlife identification, ethics, laws and regulations, and firearms safety and handling. In order to purchase a hunting license in Michigan, individuals born on or after January 1, 1960, is required to successfully complete a hunter education course.

This traditional course will take place over two days, with the first day being in the classroom and second being a field day. Attendance is required for both days. There is no minimum age requirement; however, students under 10 years of age shall be accompanied by a parent, legal guardian or other adult approved by the parent or legal guardian. 
