Bullseye--Precision Pistol Fundamentals by Brian Miller

- 1. Stance—The stance is primarily perpendicular to the target while making it comfortable. Rotate your stance so your red dot or iron sights are centered in the Bull.
- 2. Grip—The grip must be firm like a firm handshake but not to the point of causing tremors.
- 3. Sight Picture—This must be consistent each and every time whether it's a center of bull alignment or a 6 O'clock hold.
- 4. Trigger Pull—must be an uninterrupted pulling of the trigger until the pistol fires *while not moving the sight picture*. Generally, if you take the shot when it looks right the shot will be somewhere outside of the black. Usually low, left.

If the Bullseye shooter performs these fundamentals for each and every shot, it will be a good scoring shot. This can also be applied to any shooting discipline not just Bullseye. Hope this helps other shooters.

Electronic Gates

The electronic gates open and will close 30 seconds after fully open, if the gate begins to close and about to hit your car stop immediately. The gate will stop once it touches your car and retreat backwards without causing any damage. You will damage your vehicle if you continue. The club is not responsible!

Guest

Is defined as anyone 18 years of age and older who are not an immediate family residing in the same household as the general member. TRAP & SKEET REPORT by Mike Meyer

Wow !! Talk about tough competition! Our high school trap teams ran into it at the U.S.A. High School Clay Target League National Tournament. Out of 220 teams from throughout the nation, only the top 80 qualifiers were allowed to shoot in the team finals. The Valley Lutheran team, consisting of Ben Tomandl, Collin Engelhardt, Rylee Ross, Matt Iliff and Zach Lamont, qualified in 39th, with a 472 out of 500 to advance to the team finals. Valley shot a 470 in the team finals for 40th place in the nation. Unfortunately, Nouvel-Freeland, was not able to qualify as a team.


In the individual qualifier, 21- 100 straights were shot by the competition. Only those shooters who achieved a score in the High 90's were able to advance. This included Ben Tomandl and Collin Engelhardt from Valley Lutheran, and Thomas Witten, Ryan McDonald and Ryan Quackenbush from Nouvel-Freeland.

The final scores of our five individual qualifiers were:

Ben Tomandl - 98 79th in the nation Thomas Witten - 98 86th " " Ryan McDonald - 97 109th " " Ryan Quackenbush - 97 119th " " " Collin Engelhardt - 96 144th " " "

Can you imagine, just missing 2 targets out of 100 puts you in 79th or 86th place?

Peach Pizza Dessert

For National Peach Month

Ingredients

- Preheat oven to 400
- 1 roll out refrigerated thin crispy pizza dough, slightly room temperature can substitute refrigerated pie
- 1 egg white
- 16 oz. frozen peach slices, slightly thawed
- 3 Tbl. turbinado sugar
- 1 tsp. ground cinnamon
- ¼ cup coconut, shredded and sweetened
- OPTIONAL for Serving:
- Vanilla Ice Cream
- Whipped Cream or Whipped Topping

Instructions

Use a pizza pan, preferably with air holes in the pan.

Lightly coat the pan with cooking spray.

Roll out the pastry on the pan. Use a pastry brush and lightly coat the dough with an egg white wash.

Arrange the peach slices on the dough leaving about one inch from the perimeter.

Crimp the dough around the perimeter with the peaches.

Use some of the remaining egg white and coat the pizza dough. Discard any remaining egg white.

Combine the cinnamon and turbinado sugar. Sprinkle on the peaches and exposed dough. Sprinkle on the coconut for baking, sprinkle on after baking OR omit. Your choice. Bake in a preheated 400 oven for 17 to 18 minutes or until golden brown crust.

Saginaw Field & Stream Club 2023 Hunter Safety Class

Hunter education trains new hunters to be safe, legal and responsible hunters. Topics covered include understanding wildlife management, wildlife identification, ethics, laws and regulations, and firearms safety and handling. In order to purchase a hunting license in Michigan, individuals born on or after January 1, 1960, is required to successfully complete a hunter education course.

This traditional course will take place over two days, with the first day being in the classroom and second being a field day. Attendance is required for both days. There is no minimum age requirement; however, students under 10 years of age shall be accompanied by a parent, legal guardian or other adult approved by the parent or legal guardian. 
