

PRESIDENT'S THOUGHTS

Cooler temperatures and back to school unfortunately means the 2023 shooting season is entering its final stage. As you transition from recreational shooting to hunting season, you'll want to read the new DNR rules. There have been some notable changes that you need to know. During your hunts I encourage you to think about the Conservation Pledge:

"I give my Pledge as an American to Save and Faithfully Defend from Waste, the Natural Resources of my Country – it's Air, Soil and Minerals, it's Forest, Waters, and Wildlife."

Let us see those racks! Send me a photo of your successful hunts with information you would like to share. For example, name, location, points, weight, firearm, caliber, etc. and we'll publish them in newsletters all season long. I wish you all safe and successful hunts. I'm excited to see your photos.

Speaking of changes, are you aware the federal gun laws passed last year have language regarding federal funding for school outdoor education programs? Schools will not receive federal funding for outdoor education programs that involve archery and firearms. You read that right. The Rich Men North of Richmond are continuing to attack our way of life. This is no mistake they also understand that children are our future. If Congress does not amend this language schools will be forced to eliminate their programs or require parents to fund them. I encourage you to stay informed, involved, and contact your representative.

Update from the August board meeting:

Are your children involved or interested in the 4-H shooting sports? If so, the club is under consideration to host the 2024 State 4-H Shoot. Contact your local 4-H club for more information on how to get involved.

One of the more common requests we receive is regarding permanent steel targets on the ranges. The board recently approved a request to add permanent steel on the 10, 50, and 100-yard ranges. Over the next few months, we will finalize the design and install them. If things go well, we will look for additional ways to incorporate steel on the ranges. If we begin to see safety issues or intentional damage, the steel targets will be removed without notice. The Standard Operating Procedures will be amended to state: Paper targets only. Except for steel provided by the club.

Clubhouse hours for Tuesdays have been changed to 5pm to 8pm.
