Should you wish to complete your test during one of the upcoming new member orientations you are welcome to join us on any of the third Tuesdays of the month— October 16, November 21, or December 19 at 7:00 p.m. If you don't receive your packet in the mail or if you have questions, please contact us as soon as possible so that we can avoid any issues. You can also complete your renewal in-person at the clubhouse during our business hours, Tuesday 5pm to 8 pm and Saturday 8am to 12pm. Renewals can also be completed via snail mail or in the mailbox at the clubhouse side door. To avoid having to attend the membership orientation class and paying the initiation fee please get your 2024 membership renewal done early.

#### DYI Bore Sighting a Rifle

Pre setup your rifle prior to heading out to the range to zero your rifle by bore sighting your rifle with your scope. There are a couple of methods. The new modern method is using a laser and then there is the long-standing low-cost effective looking through the barrel method.


#### Modern laser method:

- 1. Verify your rifle is unloaded and there is no ammo within your work around.
- 2. Place your rifle into a support system that prevents the rifle from moving while adjusting the turrets.
- 3. Place a target out at 25 yards "tip" a reflective target is best for daylight hours to see the laser dot.
- 4. Insert laser device pre-manufactures instructions, turn on the laser and adjust the rifle's position until laser dot is on target.
- Without touching the rifle look through the scope and adjust the elevation and windage turrets until crosshairs are lined up on the laser dot.

#### Looking through the barrel method:

- 1. Verify your rifle is unloaded and there is no ammo within your work around.
- 2. Remove bolt or bolt carrier from the rifle.
- Place your rifle into a support system that prevents the rifle from moving while adjusting the turrets.
- 4. Place a target out at 25 yards. "tip" solid color paper or cardboard with a bright mid-size
- Looking through the barrel, adjust the rifle until you see the bright dot centered in the barrel.
- 6. Without touching the rifle look through the scope and adjust the elevation and windage turrets until crosshairs are lined up on the bright dot sticker.

Note if you do not have 25 yards at home set the target out as far as possible and adjust the crosshair about one to two inches low of center this will ensure the bullet impact will be low at that distance but closer to center at a 25 yard target as the bullet is still rising.

The gate will stop once it touches your car and retreat backwards without causing any damage. You will damage your vehicle if you continue. The club is not responsible!

Everyone is welcome on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays on the skeet fields and Tuesdays and Saturdays on the trap fields. If you are a reloader, we have recently gotten shipments of primers, powders and shot. So, stop in, shoot a few rounds and stock up on supplies.

For the students who participate on one of the two high-school clay target teams who shoot at the club, one of the major obstacles is costs. 
