Should you wish to complete your test during one of the upcoming new member orientations you are welcome to join us Tuesday, November 21st or Tuesday, December 19th. #### OPPOSE TO COMMERCIAL TAKE OF GAMEFISH

Dear Concerned Conservationist,

#### MICHIGAN'S SPORTFISHING HERITAGE IS AT RISK

New legislation dropped yesterday in the Michigan House would put Michigan's \$2.3 B recreational angling industry and Michigan's rich fishing heritage at risk.

#### **TAKE ACTION NOW**

HB 5108, sponsored by Rep. Jason Morgan (D-Ann Arbor), would allow for the state-licensed commercial take of game fish, including lake trout, smallmouth, panfish, walleye, perch and other game fish.

These fish are planted, reared and managed using recreational angler monies through fishing license sales and the Dingell-Johnson Sportfishing Act, which levies an excise tax on fishing equipment and is apportioned back to states for fisheries work.

This legislation would have an immeasurable impact on our recreational fishery and outdoor heritage, as well as the 171,000+ jobs it supports.

Similar legislation was attempted once before, and conservationists like yourself helped stop the legislation before it got any real traction and instead moved a commercial fishing package that protected game species.

Our fishing heritage needs you again.

The electronic gates open and will close 30 seconds after fully open, if the gate begins to close and about to hit your car stop immediately. The gate will stop once it touches your car and retreat backwards without causing any damage. You will damage your vehicle if you continue. The club is not responsible!

#### Guest

Is defined as anyone 18 years of age and older who are not an immediate family residing in the same household as the general member. Guests are required to pay the \$5.00 guest fee for each range used. Mailboxes are located on each range. Immediate family is defined as your spouse and children. Youth ages 17 and under shoot free while companied by a general member.

#### TRAP & SKEET REPORT by Steven Witten

The Trap and Skeet fields remained busy through October. We've had the regular shooters, some guests stopping in to hone their skills before hitting the fields and the high school teams wrapping up the USA High School Clay Target League Fall season, which ended on the 28th. This season the club hosted a combined total of 29 shooters on the Valley Lutheran (13) and Nouvel Catholic Central/Freeland (16) teams. Valley finished 3rd in their conference of eight teams and Nouvel/Freeland finished 7th in their conference of ten teams – each season the teams across Michigan are divided into conferences based on team size. The focus of the short Fall season, with 16 of the 29 shooters being new to the sport, was on fundamentals and incremental improvement for each shooter. With no post-season tournaments, the Fall season helps build the skills necessary to compete effectively in the Spring league and the post-season State and National tournaments, where historically, our teams have done a great job of individually representing their schools and collectively representing the Saginaw Field and Stream Club. We expect to see this tradition continue as the teams move from their infancy into their 4th Spring season in 2024.

**Valley Lutheran's Trap team top finishers** included Blake L., Nathan C., and Matthew I. Blake posted a 21.2 per-round average, landing him an 8th place finish in conference 2. Nathan and Matthew each posted 21.0 averages, tying them for a 10th place conference 2 finish.

**Nouvel/Freeland's Trap team top finishers** included Cayden G., Charlie B., and Sean O. Cayden's 21.5 average earned him a 17th place finish in conference 3. Charlie's 21.4 average landed him 18th place in conference 3 and Sean's 18.5 average tied him for 49th place.

**Nouvel/Freeland's Skeet team top finishers** included Cayden G., Aidan S., and Isaiah F, with 17.1, 16.8 and 16.2 per-round averages, earning them conference finishes of 15th, 16th, and 20th.

Valley Lutheran's and Nouvel/Freeland's Top Rookie shooters were Valley's Alex S. and Nouvel/Freeland's Caleb J. with 18.3 and 17.2 per-round averages, respectively.

Shooters shooting 25 Straights in the league included Valley's Jefferson S. and Matthew I. and Nouvel/Freeland's Owen G. and Sean O.

Remember, everyone, including your guests and the public, are welcome on the Skeet fields Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, and the Trap fields on Tuesdays and Saturdays. We hope to see you soon!

**Dates: November 4th to November 12th** 

Time: 8AM to 4PM

Our Hunter Sight In Days is a 9 day event, open to the public. Hunters may sight in rifles / hunting handguns while our volunteers help spot your shots, adjust your sights or scope and maintain safe conditions at and behind the firing line. You may sight in more than one firearm, and you are allowed to shoot enough to safely get zeroed in.

\*\*Please note that we have no method for credit card use on our range facilities. Cash only please.\*\*

Distance options in yards: 25, 50, 100

Please sign in at the 50/100 yard ranges prior to going to a bench and setting up. Shooting will stop at 4:00 PM. Please get there as early as you can before the last couple of days before the opening of deer season, as there can be quite a crowd. Saginaw Field and Stream Club will provide bench rest, support bags, spotting scope, and targets. When possible with enough volunteer a spotter.

"Sight In Days" is an important part of Saginaw Field and Stream Club annual fundraising. Everyone out there helping is a volunteer please be courteous and patient. If you're a member, and don't want to pay the \$5.00 sight in fee during the event hours, then sight-in prior to the event or after 4 pm on the event days.
