2024 MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL TEST QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Here is the test question and answers. The questions missed mostly were questions 1, 2, 3, and 5. Please read up on our Standard Operating Procedure so they you are not violating any rule that will result in being expelled from the club. If you see unsafe practices politely discuss them.

- 1. What are the club's shooting hours? Answer 8am to sunset
- 2. The club prohibits rapid fire defined as? Answer More than 2 shots a second
- 3. Dogs must be leashed while on club property April-June? Answer True or when around other members as requested
- 4. Firearm must remain cased/bagged while being transported to the firing line? Answer True
- 5. During a cold range, individuals must remain behind the yellow line (50 and 100 –yard ranges)? Answer **True unless going down range for your target.**
- 6. When may individuals recover spent casings/hulls from the ranges? Answer When it is their own and you want to keep it.
- 7. You must show your membership card if requested? Answer True
- 8. When shooting a round of Skeet/Trap your action must remain open until it is your turn to shoot? Answer True
- 9. During Skeet/Trap you are allowed to walk or change stations with a loaded firearm? Answer False
- 10. Whether intentional or unintentional, if I am reckless in my actions and I cause an incident I may be held _____ liable? Answer Both criminally and Civilly.
- 11. Who are range Safety Officers (RSO)? Answer Everyone

Are as follows, 8 AM until sunset, use the hunting guide to determine sunset. Organized events under lights may go to 10 PM. Lights on all ranges are for organized events only.

It is YOUR RESPONSIBILITY to know Range Rules!

Range Rules are available on the clubs website print off copies for your range bag. Check back occasionally as they may get updated.

Electronic Gates

The electronic gates open and will close 30 seconds after fully open, if the gate begins to close and about to hit your car stop immediately. The gate will stop once it touches your car and retreat backwards without causing any damage. You will damage your vehicle if you continue. The club is not responsible!

Guest

Is defined as anyone 18 years of age and older who are not an immediate family residing in the same household as the general member. Guests are required to pay the \$5.00 guest fee for each range used. Mailboxes are located on each range. Immediate family is defined as your spouse and children. Youth ages 17 and under shoot free while companied by a general member.

Annie's real name was Phoebe Ann Moses, but since her sisters always called her "Annie", and the fact that she lived near the town of Oakley, Ohio, she naturally chose the combination of both for her professional name.

Our little Annie had an exceptional talent for marksmanship from the age of eight when she took her first shot at a nearby squirrel, with her father's muzzle-loading rifle. It wasn't long before she was putting meat on the table and selling game to a local grocery store. It was her income that helped pay-off a \$200 mortgage on the family house.

Her shooting reputation eventually caught the attention of a Cincinnati hotelkeeper. He arranged a shooting contest between 15-year-old Annie and the professional sharpshooter, Frank Butler, who was traveling around the country, challenging local marksmen.

It was said that Butler actually laughed when he first saw his opponent. He hit 24 out of 25 targets. Annie hit all 25. It must of been that last shot that won his heart. The two were married the following summer and they stayed married for 50 years. They died within three weeks of each other in 1926.

Cupid can shoot his arrows, but I think Annie Oakley wasn't far behind him with her own shooting. As I researched her, I came across this statement that made me smile... "She outgunned a professional sharpshooter—and then married him." I've always liked the motto: "Behind every good man is a woman.....with a gun."



Michigan Out-of-Doors Youth Camp

The Michigan Out-of-Doors Youth Camp is held for six to eight weeks during each summer season at the Cedar Lake Outdoor Center, located in Chelsea, MI. History--Michigan United Conservation Clubs has operated summer youth camp programs continuously since 1946. During this time, more than 58,000 youth have learned to enjoy the outdoors safely and have left camp with a deeper appreciation and respect for the natural world.

Completed in 1940, the Cedar Lake Outdoor Center is rich in Michigan history. It was built by the Civilian Conservation Corps and has been maintained by the DNR and MUCC in the years since.
