Saginaw Field & Stream now has an insurmountable lead in the Winter Traveling Trap League. We lead both the Shiawassee and Frankenmuth teams by over 100 birds with one shoot to go and that's at our own field. The only possible downside is that the shoot is the morning after our Field and Stream All-Sports Banquet at Horizons.



Registration is underway for the USA High School Clay Target League. The spring league has always been the premiere season with the highest participation. This spring we expect to see that trend continue and we're anticipating 40 trap shooters and 7 skeet shooters. While the season officially starts the last week of March, don't be surprised to see an increased number of young shooters on the ranges getting in some preseason practice. Both the Valley Lutheran and Nouvel Catholic/Freeland teams have a history of producing successful teams and individual shooters – we expect that tradition to continue this season.


