- MUCC Convention update was given. Recent NRC meeting the NRC voted to shorten coyote hunting season to 9 months.

- Several ground maintenance improvement items. Items include main and South driveway, removal of old unused shelters, and lake access.
- Purchase of a Point of Sales system. The system will allow the club to process payments more effectivity and reducing usage cost.

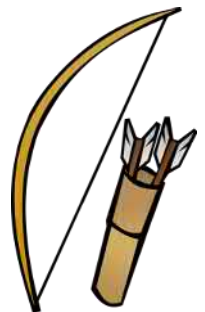

Registration not required and it is not necessary to attend every session.

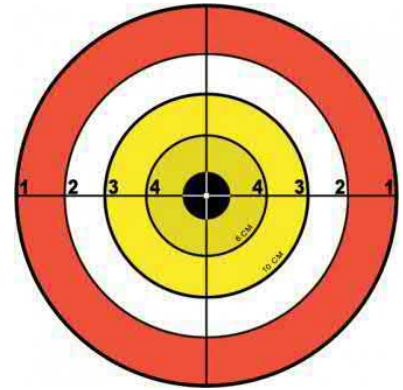
