TRAP & SKEET REPORT by Mike Meyer

The Trap (and Skeet) fields have been busy recently. Valley Lutheran and Nouvel Catholic/Freeland have about 40 youth shooters. We have spread them out between Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Saturday so that they don't completely dominate our regular Tuesday and Saturday shooting hours. If you want to see some young talent, come out to the club and watch them. If you want to shoot, bring a gun, and maybe you can learn something to improve your own shooting skills. The teams will be shooting regularly until about the middle of June to complete practice and virtual competition and prepare for the State tournament in Mason, Michigan on June 15-16. Then, those that qualify will be practicing for the National Tournament in Mason July 10-14.



The club partially subsidizes the high school shooting by paying for their target fees. Last year, this came to over \$5000. If you would like to help them out with a donation, please see any club officer for assistance.

Among our regular shooters, Danny Rosales stands out for his obvious shooting skills. Throughout last year, this winter and early spring, he dominated the skeet field with straight after straight. Now he has added trap to his shooting repertoire and is starting to dominate trap as well. (see below for straights shot.)

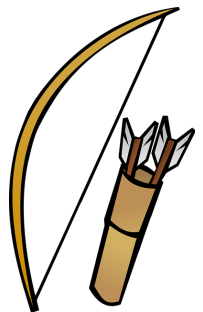
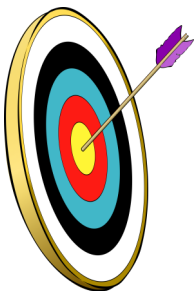


ARCHERY REPORT by Mike Schoch
