## President's Commentary

First of all, I would like to thank the members who turned out on the 19<sup>th</sup> special meeting to vote on the dues/bylaw changes. A two thirds majority was required to pass the question. After some explanation and discussion, an amendment from the floor was made to increase the 10-dollar amount to 20 dollars. More discussion on this and then the vote was taken. The results were 40 in favor and 4 against. Organizations are run by those who show up. The dues for the 2027 year starting in October of 2026 will be General Membership 85\$ plus 5\$ MUCC Dues 90\$ Associates are still at 35\$. This equates to \$7.50 a month for a private playground. I know there is going to be wailing and gnashing of teeth over this increase, BUT the dues **must support the base costs** of the club. If we do nothing extra, our bills will be paid.

Saturday has come and gone. The 2026 banquet is history. Over 500 people were in attendance and from the looks of things everyone enjoyed themselves. Your club's banquet committee outdone themselves this year. I would like to recognize an unsung hero of our club and banquet committee. David Moeller has worked on all 26 banquets; he has collected 98% of the prizes and worked to select all the firearms given away. He had started prize acquisitions right after the banquets end for the next year. You are to be congratulated Dave, I don't think there has ever been a club accomplishment such as this. This banquet, a single event, has brought in over a quarter million dollars for the club. These funds helped pay for the club house and now they are helping with the loans. If we had to rely on dues money we wouldn't have what we have now. Dave's work has made a lot possible. 'THANK YOU, Dave Moeller'. If you haven't been to a club banquet, you owe it to yourself to attend and see what you have been missing.

Now for a more serious matter, we have three director's positions open, if you have interest in your club and would like to take a hand in its management, give me a call or email or contact any current board member. We need you! We also need kitchen help, are there any cooks out there? We have three options for help at the club, one, volunteer or two pay to get it done or three, stop the activity.

Spring is finally here, very soon the club's activities will be starting up. There are several different events going on, come on out and participate, or watch, we have people who will help you out if you're unfamiliar with any type of the events.

Saginaw Field and Stream were victorious again in the Winter Traveling Trap League. Frankenmuth came in second and Shiawassee came in third. Saginaw has won the trophy since before Covid won it in 2021. We sent the trophy to the Frankenmuth club so that they can keep it dusted, and maybe give them some incentive next year. Our annual league banquet is at Frankenmuth.

The Trap ranges are starting to come alive with the High School trap teams gearing up for their 2026 Spring Competition. The Nouvel/Freeland teams will be doing the bulk of their practice and competition on Monday and Wednesday evenings. Valley Lutheran will be shooting on Thursday evenings and Saturday Mornings.
