TRAP & SKEET REPORT by Mike Meyer/Steven Witten

The Trap and Skeet fields have been busy the last few months as the weather turned warmer and our high school trap and skeet teams concluded their regular seasons and began practicing for the State and National tournaments. We're fortunate to be home field for the Valley Lutheran and Nouvel Catholic Central/Freeland teams, which had a combined total nearly 50 high school and middle school students shooting this Spring. The growth and interest in the teams we are experiencing locally, as well as what the USA High School Clay Target League is experiencing, suggests the popularity of high school/middle school shotgun sports shows no signs of slowing down. That's good news the Club and shooting sports in general!



Both teams were able to bring home some new trophies for their regular season conference finishes. Valley Lutheran's Trap team finished in 1st place in Class 1A Conference 5. Nouvel Catholic Central/Freeland's Trap team finished 2nd place in Class 2A Conference 1 and their Skeet team finished 2nd place in Class 1A Conference 2. Congratulations to all the team members!

In the State Trap Tournament, which was held in the middle of June, both Valley Lutheran and Nouvel/Freeland missed a few too many birds to medal. Valley's top-5 Trap shooters finished with a combined score of 446 out of 500 - Elijah Biber 94, Alex Ladouce 89, Zach Lamont 89, Matthew Iliff 88, and Jefferson Schuette 86. Nouvel/Freeland's top-5 Trap shooters finished with a combined score of 465/500 - Ryan Zamora 94, Charlie Beldyga 94, Fletcher LeBaron 94, Aidan Smolarek 92, and Valentino Medina 91, and their top-5 Skeet shooters finished with a combined score of 393 - Fletcher LeBaron 87, Joseph Lynch 86, Isaiah Field 77, Ethan Glaza 74, and Danny Walker 69, missing a 3rd place trophy by 2 targets.

Both teams will be sending a combined 15 students to the National Tournament, July 10 - 14 in Mason, Michigan at the Michigan Trap Shooting Association grounds. If you see them on the fields before then, wish them luck!

Saginaw Field & Stream Club 2024 Hunter Safety Class

Hunter education trains new hunters to be safe, legal and responsible hunters. Topics covered include understanding wildlife management, wildlife identification, ethics, laws and regulations, and firearms safety and handling. In order to purchase a hunting license in Michigan, individuals born on or after January 1, 1960, is required to successfully complete a hunter education course.

This traditional course will take place over two days, with the first day being in the classroom and second being a field day. Attendance is required for both days. There is no minimum age requirement; however, students under 10 years of age shall be accompanied by a parent, legal guardian or other adult approved by the parent or legal guardian.
