### **Club Shooting Hours**

Are as follows, 8 AM until sunset, use the hunting guide to determine sunset. Organized events under lights may go to 10 PM. Lights on all ranges are for organized events only.

Range Rules are available on the clubs website print off copies for your range bag. Check back occasionally as they may get updated.

### **Electronic Gates**

The electronic gates open and will close 30 seconds after fully open, if the gate begins to close and about to hit your car stop immediately. The gate will stop once it touches your car and retreat backwards without causing any damage. You will damage your vehicle if you continue. The club is not responsible!

### **Guest**

Is defined as anyone 18 years of age and older who are not an immediate family residing in the same household as the general member. Guests are required to pay the \$5.00 guest fee for each range used. Mailboxes are located on each range. Immediate family is defined as your spouse and children. Youth ages 17 and under shoot free while accompanied by a general member.

## Trap & Skeet Report by Mike Meyer

Congratulations to Nick Horenziak and Danny Rosales for their 25-straight on the Skeet Field. The Trap fields have been pretty much dominated by the High School Trap Teams. Shooters with straights since last reported are: Fletcher L – 50 Straight, Jackson A, Braeyden S, Ethan G, Colton M, Cayden G, Jack S, Alex S (2), Darrell T, and Connor M. All except Darrell are High School Students.

Someone has been deliberately causing damage on the 50 Yd range with a shotgun. Target Frames have been shot up, there is bird shot in one of the baffle support posts, and one of the Blue plastic drums has been destroyed with shotgun blasts. If anyone has an idea who might be using a shotgun with bird shot on the 50 Yd range, please let a Director know. Shotguns are only allowed on the 50 and 100 yd ranges to sight in with slugs. Shotgun patterning is to be done on the patterning board west of the trap fields. People deliberately causing damage to club property are subject to expulsion.

# Proposed By-Laws Changes

Due to the demise of Michigan United Conservation Clubs, we have to change our y-Laws.

## Current

### ARTICLE 8 - DUES

- A. The Club annual dues for a General member shall be eighty-five (85) dollars plus MUCC dues (currently \$5), and shall cover the period of January first (1) through December thirty-first (31). If membership is applied for after September 1, the dues shall cover the period of September 1 of the current year through December 31 of the following year. In addition, there shall be an initiation fee equal to thirty-five (35) dollars for all new General membership applications. This initiation fee is suspended for membership applications received during the period July 1 through August 31 Amended 03/19/26
- B. All regular members are required to be members of MUCC. Amended 11/10/16

## Proposed

- A. The Club annual dues for a General member shall be eighty-five (85) dollars, and shall cover the period of January first (1) through December thirty-first (31). If membership is applied for after September 1, the dues shall cover the period of September 1 of the current year through December 31 of the following year. In addition, there shall be an initiation fee equal to thirty-five (35) dollars for all new General membership applications. This initiation fee is suspended for membership applications received during the period July 1 through August 31.
